The *Reflections of the Past* collection features pieces glazed in Antique Green. EFP's interpretation of Grueby's famous green glaze was introduced last year. It has been exciting to experiment with this new glaze, and we are pleased to present several new offerings in Antique Green in this catalog.

As with Grueby's green glaze, a range of textures is possible with Antique Green. A variety of factors influence the degree of curdling visible on a finished piece. Some pieces have a smoother texture, while on others the curdling is more pronounced. A few examples are shown in the color chips on page 19. Our artists have limited control over the degree of curdling on a particular piece. While it's true that there are chemical processes involved, pottery making is an art, not a science, and some aspects of the finished piece must be left to fate.



GLAZES

EFP's glazes are admired for their richness, depth and texture. Our artists have developed matte crystalline glazes that are amazingly similar to the glazes used by the old Arts and Crafts potteries. During firing, the thick glazes become molten, and the force of gravity pulls them down the piece. This running and blending creates marvelous, and sometimes unpredictable, effects. The firing process also brings out crystals, which add depth and richness to color.

Each of EFP's glazes is identified in this catalog by a 2-letter code. Color chips and general descriptions for each glaze choice appear here. For aesthetic and technical reasons, most pieces are offered in either a single color combination or in a limited range of colors. Please be aware that variations within a color do occur. This is due to naturally occurring fluctuations in the raw materials used to make the glazes, and to a variety of factors in the firing process.

Please note that our pottery is NOT water-tight or food-safe. It is designed for decorative use only. We do not recommend putting water directly into our vases. If you wish to display live flowers, we suggest using a glass or plastic cup or a floral liner and a drip pan. This will help to protect your investment in your piece and will also protect your furniture from water damage.



Aurora (AU): A dramatic combination of blues and greens, creating a streaking effect reminiscent of the aurora borealis. For pieces available in this glaze, see page 12.



Indigo (IN): A deep, cool blue with charcoal-gray crystals; similar to the color of a clear sky an hour after sunset



Seaspray Blue (SB): A medium, bright blue with green tones; similar to the color of a tropical ocean



Leaf Green (LG): A deep, pure green; similar to the color of a maple leaf in July



Chestnut Green (CN): A dark grayish-green with brown tones; similar to the color of a ripe green olive



Antique Green (AG): A textured glaze that is our interpretation of the famous "Grueby green." A range of the textures possible with this glaze are shown here. For more information on this glaze, see page 5; for pieces available in this glaze, see pages 4–5 and 17.

Satin Yellow (SY): A deep, golden yellow; similar to the color of yellow mustard



Pumpkin (PK): a rich burnt orange with reddish undertones and mustard-yellow highlights; similar to the color of a pumpkin pie



Crystalline Purple (CP): A very dark purple with red and brown tones; similar to the color of a ripe eggplant



Prairie Grass (PG): A harmonious blending of glazes containing brown, rust, and yellow crystals, flowing into a quiet grayish-green. See page 6.



Stone (ST): An earthy blending of gray-green tones, reminiscent of a rocky cliff face on a chilly November day. For pieces available in this glaze, see page 8.



The Ephraim Faience Pottery studio occupies a converted barn which is nestled in the rolling hills of south-central Wisconsin. The natural beauty that surrounds us is a great source of inspiration. The colors of our glazes reflect the colors of the sky and land as they change with the seasons – deep oranges and warm golds in the fall, icy indigo and purple in the winter, and rich green and blue in the spring and summer months.



Autumn Wheat (AW): A beautiful blending of light, medium and darker toned golds, reminiscent of a wheat field at harvest time. For pieces available in this glaze, see pages 8 and 17.



Moss (MO): A subtle blending of our Leaf Green and a special crystalline moss green resulting in an attractive monochromatic streaking effect. For pieces available in this glaze, see page 9.



Sunlight (SU): A subtle blending of our Satin Yellow and a special crystalline sunlight yellow resulting in an attractive monochromatic streaking effect. For pieces available in this glaze, see page 9.




